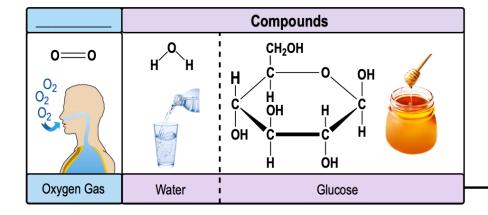

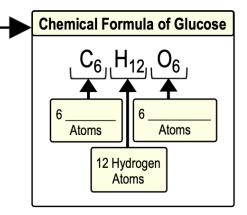
• Chemical _____: attractive forces between atoms, holding them together to form molecules & compounds.

□ Chemical Formula: reveals the ______ & ____ of atoms in a molecule (ex. C₆H₁₂O₆).



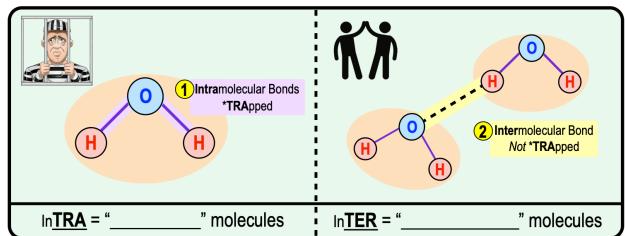


Intramolecular vs. Intermolecular Bonds

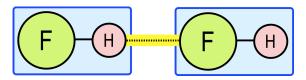

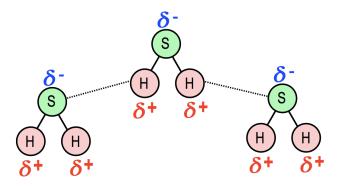

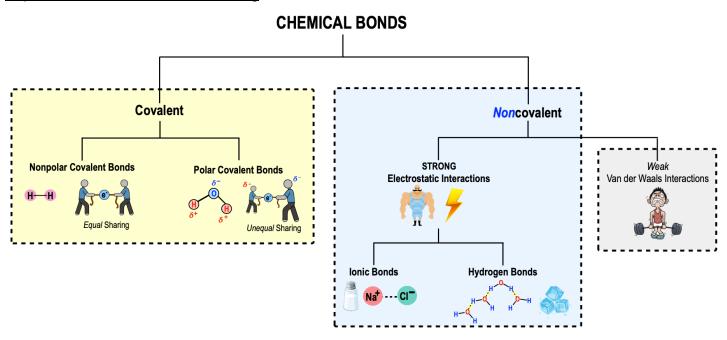
