
CONCEPT: UNDERSTANDING ADDICTION

Introduction

- ◆ Addiction: treatable _____ marked by compulsive use of a *substance* or *behavior*, despite negative consequences.
 - Substances (drugs): create a change in brain ______, altering perception, consciousness, & mood.
 - Behavior: habits involving activities such as gambling, shopping, video games, etc.
- ◆ Addiction occurs when brain's _____ and motivation systems are disrupted by the substances.



Tolerance

Larger amounts of drugs needed to achieve the same effects.

Withdrawal

Unpleasant physical and psychological symptoms due to absence of drug.

▶ Withdrawal is caused by body's inability to function normally _____ the presence of a drug.



• Can lead to substance abu	rse.			
♦ Substance abuse:	and repeated legal or illegal drug use, causes harm	illegal drug use, causes harm/problems to self or others.		
• Can progress into substan	ce use (SUD).			
	Substance Use Disorder Cluster of cognitive, behavioral, and physiological symptoms			

related to continued substance use despite significant problems associated with the substance. [1]
