- ◆ Intimacy: a close connection between individuals involving emotional and/or physical closeness.



### Sternberg's Triangular Theory of Love

- ◆ Psychologist Robert Sternberg proposed love is comprised of \_\_\_\_ key components: intimacy, passion & commitment.
